1. Reading Programme

- a. Book Buzz (Sec 1 & 2)
- Objective:
- to engage in critical thinking and reflection as they read, discuss, and respond to books
- reshape and add onto their understanding as they construct meaning with other readers

Activities: Literature Circle (4 roles: Discussion Director, Connector, Story Mapper, Word Wizard); role play, freeze frame, hot seating

Duration: 1 period a fortnight

Materials: 1 storybook purchased by students and e-book sourced online/from NLB

Objectives:

- Sec 2 G1 and selected G2 students to be able to read independently, to recognise words and increase their vocabulary.

Why:

To build their confidence in reading and to help them reach their reading level

When:

Once a week starting in Term 1 Week 9 (8 to 8.25 am)



2. News in Brief

- a. News Broadcast@ Classroom
- In groups of 3
- Each student reads one aspect of news [World news, Asia/ASEAN news, Home news] from online or printed copy
- a. Give a **brief context/ summary**
- b. State <u>one point/ issue</u> mentioned in the story/ article that they <u>like/ dislike or agree/ disagree</u> and explain <u>why</u>
- c. State the **impact**

Objectives:

1. To provide an opportunity for students to present their personal response to a piece of news to an authentic audience.

- 2. To build their confidence and fluency in presentation.
- 3. To value-add to the News in Brief programme.
- Who: Presenters and Audience Sec 3 students
- When: Term 2 & 3



- 3. Intensive Morning Oral Practice for Sec 4/5
- 1 to 2 weeks before the start of National Oral Exam, usually in July
- Teachers meet students in pairs or one on one for oral practice

4. Subject- Based Banding

- Sec 1 G1 and G2 offered higher academic level subject:
- G2 and G1 students AL 5 or better in a PSLE Standard subject – take it at the G3 Level;
- G1 students AL 6 in a PSLE Standard take it at G2 Level.

5. Learning Support

<u>Remedial & Consultations</u>

6. What can students do?

To build the prior knowledge

- 1. Read more newspapers, magazine articles, books
- 2. Watch news, movies with English sub-titles
- 3. Listen to English radio stations
- 4. Use the language at home or with friends
- 5. Complete ALL class assignments and homework
- 6. Produce <u>quality</u> work



6. What can students do?

- 1. Do **consistent** work in class
- 2. Listen to **feedback** given by teachers
- 3. Do more **practices** at home
- a. write an essay every week,
- b. do timed practice
- c. do more editing practices
- d. do more comprehension practices
- 4. Put in effort and hard work
- 5. Start revision early, not after Prelims (for Sec 4/5)



6. What can students do?

Be **Responsible** for their own learning Take **Initiative** to do more Arrange for **Consultations** with teachers Gather **Feedback** from teachers



7. What can parents do?

- 1. Restrict their use of mobile devices
- **2. Switch on** the TV at 8pm (CNA) and 9pm (Channel 5) watch the news
- 3. Talk about current issues
- 4. Monitor their work

- b. Doing extra work?




