

17TH STUDENT LEADERS' INVESTITURE

NFTE Programme

After working on their business proposals, our students presented their final NFTE BizPlan on the 25th and the 26th of August.

The students worked very hard on their presentations over the past few months and every one of them was enthusiastic about putting forth their ideas and persuading the judges to agree with their proposals. Some students already had certain pre-conceived ideas and concepts. Some of the girls found the designs of the jewellery intriguing and wondered if they could come up with their own collection. This eventually led to a remarkable business idea. On the other hand, some students found it nerve-racking to present in front of the judges. But at the end of the day, they polished their presentation skills and rose to the occasion.

The top 3 winners per stream, Normal (Academic) and Normal (Technical) were to represent YCKSS at NFTE Youth Entrepreneurship Challenge in November 2021.

Secondary 3 Service Learning

From the start of Term 2 to the end of Term 3, Secondary 3 students embarked on a social project. They started term 2 with researching societal issues that matter to them. They conducted interviews, surveys and online research to gather more information about the issues they were interested in.

Some issues that they were keen to explore were animal abuse, foster care, orphans, environment, food wastage and mental health. From the information and primary and secondary data gathered, students were challenged to find solutions and start campaigns to help their cause.



Willingness to grow and lead

A unique change to Service Learning was that the normal 1 hour given to students to work on the project in class was changed to HBL. Students took the initiative to meet online to plan and design their project. They met at least once in two weeks over Zoom with their group members and teachers.

Students organised booths, designed posters, made Social media campaigns and even a website to help raise awareness for their cause. On Social Media, students engaged the public with polls and questions in Instagram. At the end of the project, the Secondary 3 students presented a sharing of their entire journey with their Secondary 2 juniors. They shared their challenges and successes of the project. Some classes also went a step further to add games to engage their juniors in their sharing. This inspired the Secondary 2s to think about their own service learning project for 2022 and they also gained new insights about societal issues in Singapore.
