Learning Support

Learning Support provided by the school includes:

- Small-group remedial on a needs basis
- Consultation with Subject Teachers
- Self-directed learning via Student Learning Space (SLS)
- 2 Allied Educators to support students with special needs
- 2 School Counsellors, 5 Teacher Counsellors and 1 Education & Career Guidance (ECG) Counselling Manager to provide counselling on motivation and ECG matters



FAQs regarding Remedial

Will there be remedial conducted by the school after school?

- Structured Remedial Programme is conducted only for graduating students to help them to prepare for the National Examinations.
- For Secondary 1 to 3, remedial sessions are conducted on an ad-hoc basis, depending on students' needs.
- □ If a student needs additional support, subject teachers will arrange for ad-hoc remedial sessions with the students and keep parents/guardians informed of such sessions.



FAQs regarding Mother Tongue Language

Can my child be exempted from his/her Mother Tongue Language? [*Reasons, for eg, Foundation MTL in Primary School / non-native user*]

Due to Singapore's Bilingual Policy, all students must take a MTL.

However, students with medical conditions affecting their linguistic abilities, e.g. severe dyslexia & speech impairment, may apply for exemptions. You may contact HOD/MTL, Ms Goy Yap Ching@ goy yap ching@schools.gov.sg



FAQs regarding Mother Tongue Language

Can my child take MTL Syllabus B instead?

Yes, but do note that Lower Sec MTL Syllabus B lessons are conducted at external centres after school [once a week, 3hrs]. These lessons might affect after-school activities and CCAs.



Discipline

Attendance

- All students must attend lessons, CCAs, school events and activities regularly and punctually.

Use of Mobile Devices

- Mobile devices must be switched off and kept away once students enter the school compound. MOE CCA Policy

- CCA is **COMPULSORY** and student must participate in at least **ONE** CCA.
- Students are strongly advised to fulfill at least 75% attendance at the end of each year.

• Students should stay in their CCA till they graduate in Sec 4/5 to maximise their scores for Involvement and Attainment levels.



MOE CCA Policy

- Sec 1 and 2 students can ONLY change CCA at the end of a year. They are only allowed to change ONCE when they are in lower secondary.
- Note : Change of CCA will have impact on level of attainment in Participation domain.
- Uniformed Groups members are strictly not allowed to change CCA unless medical document is produced. UG points (e.g. rank, badge work) <u>may be lost</u>.



School CCA Policy

• Students **must inform** the teacher-in-charge when they are **unable to attend a CCA practice or are unwell.**

• They need to **submit medical certificate or relevant document** if they are unwell/absent.

 Student who is absent from his/her CCA of without valid reason will be given zero in attendance for that session.

FAQs regarding CCAs

Can my child continue to take part in external competitions for CCAs not offered by YCKSS?

The school will do our best to support individual students who are currently involved in external activities (e.g. sailing, swimming, taekwondo, track & field, artistic gymnastic, Singapore Youth Flying Club).

As long as there is a structured training programme with an external organisation, our school will be able to register the student for National School Games (NSG) competitions and credit them accordingly in the LEAPS 2.0 system.

However, they must have a school based CCA.



FAQs regarding CCAs

Can my child take part in 2 CCAs?

Student who wish to take part in another CCA must ensure that

- the two CCAs DO NOT clash in days and timings.
- he/she can manage their time (e.g. tuition, school activities, remedial, projects, etc).
- main CCA attendance must be 75% and involvement of main CCA comes first.



FAQs regarding CCAs

Why must my child go through CCA selection trials/audition?

- As the school wants to provide the best learning environment for CCA to maximise participation time and resources, each CCA has a **quota to** accept students.
- This is due to constraint of space and equipment/devices.
- Selection was based on students' attitude and willingness to try the activities during the CCA Trials and Auditions (not Primary School CCA experiences).

- What does it mean if my child is in subject based banding when she is in Express course?
- Your child in the Express Course may have a few students (from the NA & NT courses taking the SBB subject) attending the same lessons.
- At times if there is a sizable number, the NA & NT students taking the express subject may attend a separate class.



- For students who are offered SBB subjects, how will the take their National Exams? If they sit for both N & O Levels, what happens in Sec 5 during lessons for which they have completed in Sec 4?
- At Sec 4NA, NA students taking O-Level subjects will take the O Level Exam at Sec 4.
- If the student has done well for the SBB subject at O-level, the student does not need to take the SBB subject in 5N. The student can use the time during the curriculum time to revise for other subjects. Alternatively, they may wish to retake the SBB O-level subject at Sec 5.

We will remind and ensure that the canteen vendors provide sufficient food after school dismissal.




FAQs on Well-Being Matters

 PE Attire: If students want to wear PE attire to school on non- PE days, are they suppose to wear PE t-shirt with school pants/skirts or just wear full PE uniform(shorts) to school for the whole day?

• Both are allowed.



FAQs on CCAs

- Why is it compulsory to select one CCA across all categories ? What if they are allocated to the CCA that they really dislike?
 - Each CCA has a quota. As soon as a CCA fulfills its quota (mostly 1st to 3rd choices), it will not accept any more students.
 - In the event that they are not allocated a CCA from their first 3 choices, one of the next 3 choices will be allocated. It will be an opportunity for students to learn new skills and explore new interests.
 - **Exception is made to students with medical conditions.**


