

PRINCIPAL'S LETTER TO SECONDARY ONE PARENTS

Dear Parents / Guardians

Yio Chu Kang Secondary School welcomes your child/ward to our YCKSS Family! It will be an exciting year for your child/ward and your family as he/she enters a new phase in his/her life.

This Handbook has been prepared to provide you with the necessary information on education in Yio Chu Kang Secondary School. We hope it helps you to take note of the important points to better prepare your child/ward for secondary school education.

In order to safeguard your family's well-being, all necessary information is provided via this handbook and on Parents Gateway. You **DO NOT** need to come to school in person on 22nd December 2021.

You are encouraged to purchase your child's / ward's textbooks and school uniform online or at the designated dates and time slot stated on page 5.

Your child/ward will report to school on 4 January 2022 before 7:25 a.m. to his/her classroom. There will be student leaders and staff to guide your child/ward.

Do take note of the following important information:

Mass Appeal Exercise (Medical Reasons)

Students, who wish to appeal for a transfer of school due to any of the following medical reasons, may participate in the Mass Appeal Exercise (MAE):

- 1. Serious Medical Condition, e.g. chronic heart or kidney conditions. Supporting medical documents are required.
- 2. Severe Physical Impairments (Assessment reports from a qualified medical professional stating clearly the student's condition and needs are required).

Parents/Guardians will need to email vckss@moe.edu.sg for the application form on 22 December 2021 (Wednesday). You will need to email the completed application form and submit the supporting documents by 23 December 2021 (Thursday), 12 noon.

Alternatively, you may contact the school at 6456 0669 to make an appointment to come to school to apply for the Mass Appeal Exercise on 23 December 2021 (Thursday) morning.

Application without supporting documents or incomplete forms will not be processed. The application results will be released to original posted secondary school on 4 January 2022.

Successful applicants will not be able to reject the reposted school. They will not be admitted back to the original posted secondary school.

MOE Direct School Admissions

Students who have been successfully allocated to their DSA schools will not be allowed to transfer to another school. They are expected to honour their commitment to the allocated school for the entire duration of the programme.

We look forward to meeting your child/ward on 4 January 2022. Meanwhile, if you have any concerns and queries, do not hesitate to reach out to us. We hope you stay safe and well.

2. Students on Financial Assistance Scheme





2. Financial Assistance Scheme (FAS)

Note that all applications must be submitted by 23 December 2021 (Thursday), 2 pm to give sufficient processing time to arrange for textbooks and uniforms.

For Approved (Existing) Applicants

For students with approved FAS applications from their Primary Schools, please proceed to the Synergy Room (Level 1) on <u>23 December 2021 (Thursday)</u>. You can bring along the approval letter from the primary school.

The school will issue you a letter confirming your approved FAS status for 2022. You will need to submit this letter to the textbook and uniform vendors. Purchase textbooks and uniform only **AFTER** the school has issued this letter to you.

For New Applicants

New applicants for FAS are those who have not applied for assistance before in primary school. The application form is available online. You may download the application form, print and submit via email to yckss@moe.edu.sg together with the supporting documents. Alternatively, a hard copy can be collected from the General Office. 3. School Smart Cards for Concessionary Travel

All students entering Secondary One will be issued with a new Secondary School Smart Card (SSC) for concessionary travel. While students are waiting for their Secondary level SSCs to be ready, they can continue to use their Primary level SSCs for concessionary travel till end April 2022.

Students can still purchase the Bus Concession Pass (BCP) using their Primary level SSCs but they would need to purchase the BCP for Secondary School students.



2. Mother Tongue Languages

Secondary One students who are given approval by MOE to take Higher Mother Tongue Languages will have to attend lessons at external centres. Students will be informed of the designated centres.

Parents / Students who have questions regarding Asian Languages (Japanese, Arabic or Bahasa Indonesia) or Foreign Languages (French or German) at the MOE Language Centres, please email Ms Goy Yap Ching (HOD Mother Tongue Language): goy yap ching@schools.gov.sg by 23 December 2021.

3. Subject-Based Banding (SBB)

Lower Secondary N(A) and N(T) students can take English, Mathematics, Science and/or Mother Tongue Languages at a higher level if they meet the PSLE eligibility criteria at the start of the year in Secondary 1, or school-based criteria after the Secondary 1 mid-year and year-end assessments.

Each student should take no more than 3 higher-level subjects so as to ensure that he/she can cope with the overall academic demands.

From 23 December 2021 onwards, our SBB Team of HODs will contact you to explain more about SBB.

4. Art Elective Programme (AEP) and Music Elective Programme (MEP)

The secondary level AEP and MEP are four-year curriculum programmes which focus on in-depth and critical learning to deepen students' conceptual understanding of Art/Music. Application is only applicable to Secondary 1 Express, Normal (Academic) and Normal (Technical) students with potential, aptitude and passion in art or music.

In light of the required commitment to the programme, students may take AEP/MEP in place of lower secondary Design & Technology (D&T) and Food & Consumer Education (FCE) lessons to manage their curriculum time and learning load. At the Upper Secondary level, they will hence not be eligible to offer D&T and Nutrition & Food Science (NFS).

Do note that your child/ward will need to stay back for **CCA Orientation and Selection Trials/Auditions** based on their six choices across the four CCA categories (Physical Sports, Performing Arts, Uniformed Groups and Clubs) from **6 to 27 January 2021.**


It is strongly recommended that your child/ward refer to CCA Weekly Training Schedule on page 15 for their visits for CCA Orientation from 6 to 12 January 2021.

At the end of CCA Orientation period, your child/ward will then make their selection of the six CCA choices. Do refer to **CCA Weekly Training Schedule** on **page 15** and **CCA Application Form** on **page 18** for the selection of the six CCA choices. A hardcopy of this **CCA Application Form** will be issued to your child/ward and it has to be **filled up and submitted on 13 January 2021**.

It is **compulsory** for your child/ward to refer to the **CCA Selection Trials/Auditions Schedule** on **page 16** and attend CCA Selection Trials/Auditions of <u>all</u> of his/her six CCA choices.

CCA Selection Trials/Auditions period will be as follows:

- a) Your child/ward will attend CCA Selection Trials/Auditions for his/her 1st, 2nd and 3rd CCA choices only from 17 to 20 January (Week 3)
- b) Your child/ward will attend CCA Selection Trials/Auditions for his/her 4th, 5th and 6th CCA choices only from 24 to 27 January (Week 4)
